Pep Band Recap

The 2017-18 ISU Alumni Pep Band season featured quite a bit of variety!

The season started on November 25th with Senior Night for the Volleyball team. The Cyclones dispatched with the Texas Tech Red Raiders easily in straight sets, but that wasn't even the highlight of the afternoon. In addition to celebrating the Cyclone careers for four seniors, we also got to see Genesis Miranda receive a marriage proposal from her boyfriend Joel. She said yes!

The day wasn't over, however, with the men's basketball game again Western Illinois that same evening. Lindell Wigginton had the first of many 20+ point games in the season. The Leathernecks simply couldn't muster enough offense in the second half and the Cyclones pulled away 70-45. At the end of the day, it was a good warm-up for the rest of the pep band season!

The first gig of December was a women's basketball match against UC Riverside. While future AP All-American Honorable Mention Bridget Carlton had a "ho-hum" (for her) double/double, a trio of Cyclone newcomers had career days against the Highlanders. The result was a well-earned 89-66 victory and a dose of post-game "Celebrate!".

The next challenge for the men's team was MEAC powerhouse Maryland Western Eastern Shore on December 20th. The ISU youthfulness was evident as there was a challenge with consistency throughout the game. Things got a little hairy at the end, but the Cyclones were able to hold for the win. And given the holiday season, the pep band was even able to toss in a holiday tune or two.

The conference basketball seasons were up next on the calendar.

Bonus basketball! Four quarters wasn't enough for the Cyclones and Jayhawk women's teams in late December. This first of two victories in the season over the Jayhawks included overtime with Bridget Carlton going over the 1,000-point career scoring mark, including all of ISU's seven OT points.

The Big 12 conference opener for the men was the basketball version of Farmageddon versus Kansas State.

Douglas Todey took over the director's reins from Jay Chapman for the next two gigs and the band never missed a beat. However the same couldn't be said of the basketball team, as the Cyclones just could not match's KSU's hot second half shooting and ultimately fell to the Wildcats 91-75.

The last women's game of the year featured a showdown with the Oklahoma Sooners. The game was back and forth early but OU took the lead going into halftime. The Cyclones do not back down, however and tried to keep the game close. They were able to get the deficit down to one point on a couple of occasions, but ultimately fell to the Sooners by five.

More bonus basketball! 2018 started off with a men's tilt against the Texa\$ Longhorns, and the game couldn't be decided in 40 minutes. The halftime score was 31-all and regulation ended 61-61, but in the OT Texas outscored the Cyclones 13-9 and took home the victory. Keen listeners in Hilton Coliseum would have caught on to a theme in the music for the evening as the Alumni Pep Band worked through each

of the songs in the books featured in the 1980 film classic, "The Blues Brothers". If a couple more songs featured in the film are added to the repertoire, the Alumni Band could play an entire game of just Blues Brothers tunes. For what that's worth!

The 2017-18 season closed out with the first Alumni Pep Band performance for Wrestling in over a decade. The performance for Kevin Dresser's Cyclones versus Northern Colorado was just a bit different than a typical volleyball match or basketball game. While there was an opportunity for pre-game music, the flow of the meet is a bit different and only includes a single intermission between matches to play. But ISU Fights is always on deck at the end of each match to celebrate an ISU wrestler's victory. On this day, the Cyclones and the Bears split matches, but ISU fell 22-20 due to the Bears' having more bonus points. Look for the Alumni Pep Band to be asked back to support the wrestling program in future years.

All-in-all it was another successful season of entertaining the Hilton crowds! We encourage you to be on the lookout for information regarding another summer practice to pick up some new material and hope you can help keep the ISU Alumni Pep Band playing at Hilton Coliseum next season!
